## Technical Committee Report – Dave Saffel

- Report from Frequency procurement
  - Status of frequency searching

  - Update on mobile radio testing of the unit that Rodney has. – Trunking is not enabled in the radio
  - BK requesting 2 new radios to test. The KNG-2 and the BKR9000. I tested the KNG400-2 and thus far, have had no issues. I am awaiting testing of AES encryption, and if that passes, I would recommend the radio be approved. I have no information on the BKR9000.
  - Kenwood VM7000 – While the same programming software is used on this radio and earlier versions, this is a totally new radio with versions from Low Band to 800 MHz.

- Mobile Antennas – The technical committee is going to create a document of recommendation of antenna types that are desirable for use in the SIRN system. Further discussion of currently installed antennas took place at this meeting.
- Communicating with another agency having direct connectivity on 7500 consoles, utilize the direct connectivity or utilize the 911 or agency (like WVSP or turnpike) talkgroups – A talkgroup is created between 7500 consoles in a NON-RF way so that no site resources are used. Any use of this type of channel should be configured in this way, and it will NOT be heard over the air, take no resources, and be a true “intercom” type of channel.
