- T-Mobile desire to add a dish to the Welch site. Motion to approve Jim Mangus, second Dave Erwin. Passed
- Nicholas County POC indicated that Charley Bickford has programmed talkgroups that are not permitted into radios and RC Faulk is working to get a copy of the codeplug for review. Charley Bickford has been set suspended in the programmer database.
- Berkeley County Epic Headstart requests one talkgroup. Non-dispatch, valid only in Berkeley County. Motion Dave Erwin, Jim Mangus second. Passed
- Fiber run from 911 to Malden by Frontier as a backup to the microwave.
- New generator connect is completed to the radio room at Building 5.
- Morgantown Medical Command is looking to purchase an Avtec console which would require a CSSI connection.
- Motorola is back on schedule with patching. They have grown in size; it is important to not reboot until you get an indication that it is safe to do so. We finally got acknowledgement from Motorola that they have recognized the problem with recording after patching/updates. They have not necessarily found the solution after three years, but they have at least acknowledged that. Frederick County is now online with patching. The only one that is not being patched is the 911 center in Berkeley County due to not having the correct computers that would accept the patch.
- There were three servers that had problems during the update, but that has been fixed and installed.
- Shepherdstown update Several sites have been looked at for appropriateness for both frequencies and paths to a microwave location. The University has been very positive in looking at this not just for them, but for the greater good of the entire area.
- TDMA issue after update Marshall County tested 9 versions of firmware for the NX series of radios. They found two versions of firmware that worked and communicated with Kenwood about that. Kenwood is working on the tests and is creating a firmware update and hopefully it will be back this coming week
- After the upgrades, the site routers in Zone 3 had errors. Once they are rebooted, they seem to clear the error. They will watch to see if it reoccurs.
- Vendor programming issue was identified by Dave Erwin and discussion ensued. It was decided that a letter to the vendor from the SWIC office will be sent.

- Motorola updated to APX 30 for software but has not been tested yet. It is recommended to stay at 29 until further testing. 30.0.1 Firmware and tuners. All others remain the same.
- Armada update 1.36.24 Just had a programming class at the Pubic Safety Expo in Charleston.
- Master site patching continued last week. AIS issues with recording. Raleigh Co. lost approximately 12 hours of recorded traffic, WVSP experiences similar issues.
