## Technical Committee Report – Dave Saffel

- Equipment testing – Testing has begun on the Motorola NEXT radio that was provided. Motorola has not provided the number of required radios, chargers, cables, and software. Testing that was started showed that the radio did not include Encryption, Multikey, and Intelligent Priority Scan. Pete Marotta is supposed to be getting that capability and providing update to this radio. Approval of testing will not be complete until Motorola has provided all required equipment.

- Technical Committee - Fred highlighted some of the items discussed at the last technical committee meeting. (1) Updating the Approved Equipment List. (2) Encryption channels wondering if all 911's had encryption capabilities. Dirk pointed out if ordering new radios make sure to have Phase II capabilities installed when ordering.
- SIRN Conference Exercise – Fred reported on lessons learned both good and bad from the exercise at the SIRN Convention. One of the key items noted from the exercise was the need to develop a Regional ICS-205 Communications Plan.
- Linking of Radio's was a topic of discussion both pros and cons.
- Use of Regional Channels – It was generally agreed that the use of regional channels would be very beneficial when working an incident with different jurisdictions. It was noted that the State Communications Center does not "Record" radio traffic on these channels. It would fall on the host 911 center to record these transmissions. All agreed training for both users and dispatchers would be needed probably through drills and exercises.
- Audio Gateway – Some discussion was held regarding obtaining some of the Adion Gateway programs.
- Disparity – Not having standardization of zone/districts between the various agencies makes it difficult to develop and maintain communications plans and procedures. Fred canvassed the counties present to present concerns/issues: Barbour had a power issue that affected some of their radios, Randolph is getting a new 80-foot tower, Randolph EMS – Kirk reported that EMS units are now having to travel into other jurisdictions that may or may not have SIRN capabilities.
- Dirk reported that local 911s can assist at the state-owned sites by observing fuel levels for generators and taking care of some maintenance items.
- EMD – Andy reported that the EMD were getting new radios.
- DNR – Sgt. Spangler has been assigned the tasks of checking their repeaters and had asked for some assistance with identifying key holders.
- Fred asked for members to be thinking what would be needed in a regional communications plan.
- Next meeting – December 15, 2022 at the Randolph EM/911 Center.
