Individuals must be cautious to not purchase used radios that do not have this option installed and active
 - Motion was made by Dave Erwin to cause Link Layer Authentication to be mandatory in any radio purchased after June 30, 2025. Second by Tony Novel. No one opposed. It is encouraged that any radio purchased after today (July 8, 2024) be equipped with Link Layer Authentication at the time of purchase.

May 23, 2024 Ripley VFD, Ripley, WV

Opening:

The meeting was called to order at 10:06 AM by Jim Mangus, presiding chairman.

Jim Mangus explained the reason for the cancellation of the March meeting as a conflict in calendar appointments for the meeting place and the lack of furniture in the alternate (new training center) at that time.

Jim explained the importance of some of the "Maintenance Upgrade" emails that are being sent out as some of these sites will be completely off the air during these extensive upgrades.

SIEC Meeting update:

The AVIAT upgrade is only 50% complete. There are many errors being generated by this system and AVIAT has a plan to reduce them. Completion of the microwave upgrade is estimated to be in Q1 of 2025.

Technical Committee meeting:

Between the April and May SIEC meetings there were no firmware updates. Be sure to check the SIRN website for updates and approved equipment lists.

There are some radios available that have limited character displays. End users generally don't think these will work, so to discourage their use they will be bumped down to level 2 as far as purchasing.

Link Layer Authentication (LLA):

This is needed for security from hacking and use of unauthorized radios. We are not sure when this will be implemented but will add an additional cost to each newly purchased radio. Those purchasing new radios should have this option included.

The new BKR 9000 radios will soon be on the approved equipment list.



Cyber Security:

First Net and AT&T are working with cell boosters in schools. There will be many cradle points and will use satellite as the backhaul.

SIRN Conference:

September 29 - October 1, 2024 - Camp Dawson

Jim Mangus asked for recommendations for training courses needed for the conference. There was a group discussion about the need for training. The registration portal is open on the SIRN website.

Discussion:

Dustyn McConnell explained Link Layer Authentication (LLA) as two-layer authentication for your radio. When a radio attempts to log on to the network it is required to respond with a key, serial number and radio ID which will all be evaluated with a database. If they don't match the radio will not be allowed to log on. This will protect from duplicate radio IDs, someone putting an unauthorized radio on the network and will assist in locating stolen or lost radios.

It's a hassle in that every radio needs to be registered, but when done the added benefits are worthwhile. My plan is to develop a "Go Kit" which will be a cradle point and KBL in a box. I won't have the system ready for a year or so and won't know the details until then.

Roy McCallister asked if LLA will work on some of the older radios. **Dustyn** indicated the LLA has been around for some time and is part of the P25 authentication. He noted that he has not yet checked all radios in the system for compliance.

Dustyn noted that there are 50,000 radios registered in the SIRN system and full authentication will probably be a ten-year project.

Jim Mangus asked about Motorola upgrades. **Dustyn** said that it had been pushed back to Q1 of 2026.

Roy McCallister asked for an update on the state contract. **Dustyn** noted that it is out and posted on the WV State purchasing website. This contract is for Motorola only. If anyone



experiences problems with price gouging contact us and we will put pressure on the manufacturers.

Training Opportunities:

Jim Mangus reported that Raleigh County has requested a COML Class. We are looking at the week of September 23rd.

SIAC will be hosting a TA for a Pace-Plan workshop. Dates have not been set yet. SIAC will also be hosting a Webinar on Cyber Security, again the dates are not set.

Every agency should have a Cyber Security Plan in place.

We will have the grand opening of the training center on June 1st at noon. We will have the family of Walt Smittle in as we are dedicating the building to him.

Derick Wilson our Threat Preparedness Coordinator is in training and can't be with us today. We are still struggling to complete our SEGRA phone system. I had a report by someone in Ritchie County that their SIRN radio needed replaced as it wasn't working. Upon arrival I turned the volume up and it worked fine.
