- The Chair of the Technical Committee recommends that the Harris XL-200 be removed from Level 5 and restored to Level 1. There was a problem in Gilmer County that a radio locked up. Initially, a Harris representative stated that the problem was the fact that a radio did not have LTE in it, yet the LTE block in Network was checked. This is a default for the Harris RPM2 software, so it is assumed that that many if not most XL-200's and other models have that box checked without LTE Installed. The Technical Committee requested of L3Harris that the codeplug before any changes had been made and a codeplug after changes be provided to the Chair. Gilmer County is apparently programming their own radios, though there are currently NO certified programmers for L3Harris in the State. Gilmer did not provide the required before codeplug and L3Harris provided the after. It



was determined that Channel ID 3 (Channel IDEN for Harris) was still active in the replacement codeplug. This has caused problems in the past. At this point, L3Harris has provided all things requested. No one has been able to duplicate the problem of the radio locking up. It is now recommended that the XL-200 be returned to Level 1. Motion to approve to Level 1 by Fred Kinder. Second by Jim Mangus. No one opposed. We need to be very aware of those radios to be certain that the problem is not occurring again. If a problem occurs again, it will be returned to Level 5.

- Loudon County reported that there were multiple radios losing their encryption keys. There is a new version of firmware for the APX and the NEXT radios that was released June 9, 2025 that might be the fix. The firmware was not the total problem, but the new firmware worked properly.
- Technical Committee recommends approving the Motorola N50. Motion to approve Tony Novel, Second by Brooke Hess. No one opposed. Approved for Level 2
- Technical Committee recommends approving the Kenwood VM8000. Motion to approve Tony Novel, Second by Fred Kinder. No one opposed. Approved for Level 1
- There is an issue with a programmer in a county that had five radios that they just purchased from Motorola. The radio ID that was in them showed up as stolen. Turns out they purchased the radios from Motorola direct, but could not get them programmed with a vendor. They turned to a local person who programmed them very poorly with one radio ID for all five. There were problems in the code plug and improper programming (unauthorized talkgroups) in the code plug. That is going to be addressed.
- ICE wants to come to West Virginia and needs channels on our system. They need to put on 250 radios and need talkgroups. They are already authorized on the system as their training takes place in Harpers Ferry. The enforcement group is going to be more active in West Virginia so we are going to recommend 10 enforcement talkgroups initially and if they need more, we will take care of it.
- T-Mobile testing has been working very well as far as regular phone service. The phone has a satellite texting ability that is working reasonably well, but there seems to be an issue as to when it connects and when it fails to move over to the satellite. Testing will continue and T-Mobile is being advised of the issues that have occurred.
