Broadband/FirstNet – Paul Bump (GE McCabe)

- **Tower site information.** Please update your county's information.
- NEW TOPIC / QUESTION: Walt Smittle (Jackson County 911/EM) is interested constructing another SIRN Site in the Ravenswood area. A SIRN Site in that area would remove the remaining dead spots in Jackson County. Getting the County to invest in a new site (Ravenswood area) is hard to pursue because of the hardship of acquiring UHF Frequencies for a SIRN Site. Other states reuse some of the same frequencies on multiple sites such as the MARCS System in Ohio and why couldn't we do something similar here in WV. He felt that other states (besides Ohio) share the same frequencies for their systems. Walt Then asked if SIRN/SIEC could ask MARCS and other States with similar frequency sharing systems to come in and give a presentation explaining the technology and how frequency management works for them...
- (Dynamic Channeling maybe the technical term he was referring to).

 - o Participants: There were 22 attendees.
- Weirton Tower Update:
 - o Currently only has two (2) frequencies which is not enough to populate the site.
 - o The frequencies that may be available are all out of the Pittsburgh/Allegheny County area
- Sheriff Palmer from Brooke County working on business band frequencies.

• The Beaver Falls (FBI) Site:

Building has some issues including leaks which makes it an issue to put \$300,000.00 worth of
equipment there until repairs are made; Tier I site with lower range 400 frequencies from
FBI.

• Training:

 Motorola XTS/XTL programming class for SIRN Conference was cancelled; several programmers need re-certification by early 2018; will submit request for a class; Marshall County OEM has offered to host.

• Fairmont PD:

 a couple new programmers in the department however, may need some assistance with programming since this is their first time doing it. They were advised to reach out to the RIC for assistance from other programmers within the region.

• WVU PD:

Travel expenses an issue when travelling across the state to attend programming classes outside of SIRN Conference; would like to see some of the training stay closer to the area to reduce those expenses. They were advised any training in the region is open across the region & across the state as well. Submit any training needs/requests to the RIC Chair to try & get something scheduled.

• Discussion on Pursuit Channels:

- o Preston County had pursuit Maryland & Monongalia County into Pennsylvania which created several concerns with communications crossing state lines.
- O Discussion on how to handle pursuits and crossing radio regions; handing off pursuits between 911 centers.
- Console patches: How far will they work & it also ties up multiple radio channels.
- Marion County: Uses emergency button on mobiles to switch to pursuit channel.
- Preston County: Has new mics on their mobiles with button on them to activate pursuit talk group.
- Pursuit talk group & how to activate it: law enforcement preference.
- Consider setting up a two (2) regional workshops; one for I-79/I-68 Corridors (southern areas of Region 2) & another for the Northern Panhandle (northern areas of the region) & entertain exercises in both regions with law enforcement & the 911 centers. Invite representatives from neighboring states & their counties.

Good of the RIC:

- o Consider developing communication resources database within the region including equipment & personnel (COMLs).
